This was a very emotional experience, with some people having dealt with really tough situations. It was wonderful to hear how God had been working in the lives of all of the guys across the country.

The week also had a fair amount of focus on the future, especially our future having finished Relay. Mo served us really well by taking us through 1 Corinthians 12-14 focusing on how exactly we as individuals relate to the Church, especially in terms of our service and using our gifting appropriately. This was really challenging and I am still working through how to really apply everything Mo shared. Please pray that I do take all I have learnt to heart and really work it out within my local Church.

Summer Barbeque

This being exam term, not much went on in the CUs during May, but after the exams were over in June Leicester CU put on their annual summer barbeque. The event is always well received by all the students who have nothing better to do that enjoy the sun, eat lots of food and play together. This year we had a bouncy castle, some organised sporting fun, and a Christian rally driving team showing off their car!

There was an evangelistic talk which everyone sat down a very politely listened to, and afterwards many of the students had good chats about what they had heard. This was a great opportunity to express really practically our love for the students, and to share the gospel with them clearly. Please pray that our attitude and willingness to serve them had some impact, but mostly pray that the gospel they heard would change their hearts, that their eyes would be opened to the truth and their lives be transformed.

Teaching

As I said, I have applied for PGCE courses in three different universities, Leicester, Nottingham and Nottingham Trent. Teaching has always been on my radar for the future, but until recently I was putting it off in favour of getting some experience in the real working world first. However after a couple of conversations about my future in June I realised that my reasons for putting off teaching weren't really valid and I might as well get on with what I have felt drawn to for so many years. As a result of the very late decision to take on a PGCE (as well as a little disorganisation on my part) I missed the initial deadline for applications and so I'm not in the clearing process. What that means is that I have spoken to the three Universities directly and am waiting to hear back from them, with no guarantees that they will even look at my application.

If I don't get on a course this year I have a backup plan which is to look for work as a teaching assistant for a year and then reapply for 2010. I don't mind doing this at all, but obviously I would prefer to get on a PGCE course straight away! Please pray that my application would be considered by the course supervisors and that if it's God's plan for this year that I would get a place.

Church involvement

My involvement with King's Church Leicester continues to grow as time passes. I have been asked to help during the summer with preparations for our autumn Alpha course which is very exciting. I have also been asked to help run our theology training course called Word Plus over the next couple of years. These are both great opportunities for me to serve the Church and I'm really looking forward to getting stuck in even more.

I was also asked to preach back in June, which was a great privilege and came out of being asked to do the bulk of the teaching at the youth weekend away back in March. For me the biggest challenge in all of this is keeping a humble servant heart in everything I do, and constantly remembering that the only reason I can do anything at all is because of Jesus. Please pray that I would hold on to that wonderful truth as I serve in my Church.
